

Following recent ballots by teaching unions, I am writing to inform you that I have received notification that teachers at Halsnead will be taking strike action on Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th March 2023 (next week). There are many different teaching Unions within education; not all our staff are in the NEU, which is the Union that have voted to strike on this occasion. After completing a risk assessment of the school and reviewing the number of teachers that will not attend, we have made a decision to close the following classes:
