and experiences after half term!



Welcome to the Wellbeing section of our newsletter.



Talking about emotions and knowing how something makes us feel is essential in developing emotional literacy and resilience. Our whole-school approach helps us to support children to learn about their emotions and regulate their own behaviour to engage with learning and develop positive relationships with those around them.

For those children in school who have any worries or concerns — these might be that they feel anxious coming into school or may have suffered a bereavement or friendship issues - we are on hand to support.

We have calm and peaceful rooms like 'The Thrive Hive' that has been purposefully designed to be a safe space for children to have some quiet time and talk through their thoughts.

Also, you may have noticed that we have recently, revamped our outdoor classroom—'The Hub' as we wanted to create an outdoor space for children to enjoy the fresh air while calmly chatting and sharing the company of others.

Children can talk to any adult in school— their class teacher or teaching assistants and in addition, we have dedicated staff members that work across school: Mrs Whitby, Miss Wright, Mrs McGivern, and Mrs Redmond.
