CLOSING DATE 15h JANUARY 2024

- If your child's date of birth falls on or between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020, now is the time to apply for a reception class place in school for September 2024.
- There is no automatic transfer from nursery everyone must apply between 12 September 2023 and 15 January 2024 by completing the application form of the Local Authority in which you live.

- It is the responsibility of the parent/carer to ensure they have read the admission policy of each school they are considering applying for and provided all the information required to support their application this may include completing a supplementary information form with some individual schools where requested.

CLOSING DATE 31st OCTOBER 2023

If your child is currently in year 6 of primary school or their date of birth falls on or between

1 September 2012 and 31 August 2013, now is the time to apply for a year 7 secondary school place for September 2024.

There is no automatic transfer – everyone must apply between 12 September 2023

and 31 October 2023 by completing the application form of the Local Authority in

which you live.

Knowsley residents should apply by accessing the online application portal via the Knowsley website www.knowsley.gov.uk .

It is the responsibility of the parent/carer to ensure they have read the admission policy of each school they are considering applying for and provided all the information required to support their application – this may include completing a supplementary information form with some individual schools where requested.
