Year six parents/carers will have received SATs results. For clarity, here is some information regarding pupils' scores:

A 'good' score in the SATs is entirely down to the individual student and their goals and abilities. A good result will look different for everyone.

The highest score achievable for KS2 is 120. If your child has achieved anything above 100, it means they have exceeded expectations.

Expected standard is 100. A score of 110 and above is greater depth.

With regards to SATs, we are delighted to announce that 78% of children achieved expected standard in reading, writing and maths. That is up 18% from last year and it is 17% above the national standard. We are beyond proud of the children and staff – the results truly are a testament to their resilience and aspiration.



As families prepare for September, please can we reiterate the importance of correct uniform, especially PE kit. Children will need to be wearing the correct kit in order to participate in PE lessons. The information below has been copied from the uniform section of our website.
