Cinema Visit – Respectful Behaviour

Our children in Years 3–6 had a fantastic time at the cinema yesterday watching Paddington. They demonstrated the respectful behaviour we expect from Halsnead pupils and were a credit to our school.

Anti-Bullying Workshops – ‘Power for Good’

This week, children in KS1 and KS2 took part in anti-bullying workshops. The theme of this year’s workshop was ‘Power for Good’.

The children explored the idea that every choice we make plants a seed. Through guided role play and collaborative storytelling, they reflected on how kindness and responsibility grow in everyday life. They discussed what it means to be a trusted friend, an inclusive classmate and a role model others can rely on.

Celebrating Our Play Leaders

Our play leaders in Upper Key Stage 2 have been absolutely fantastic – from organising games to supporting younger pupils and even volunteering to litter pick. Some of them even completed a sweep of the cinema yesterday to ensure no rubbish had been left behind. Not only are they showing the value of respect in school, they are also demonstrating responsible citizenship in the wider community. We are incredibly proud of them.

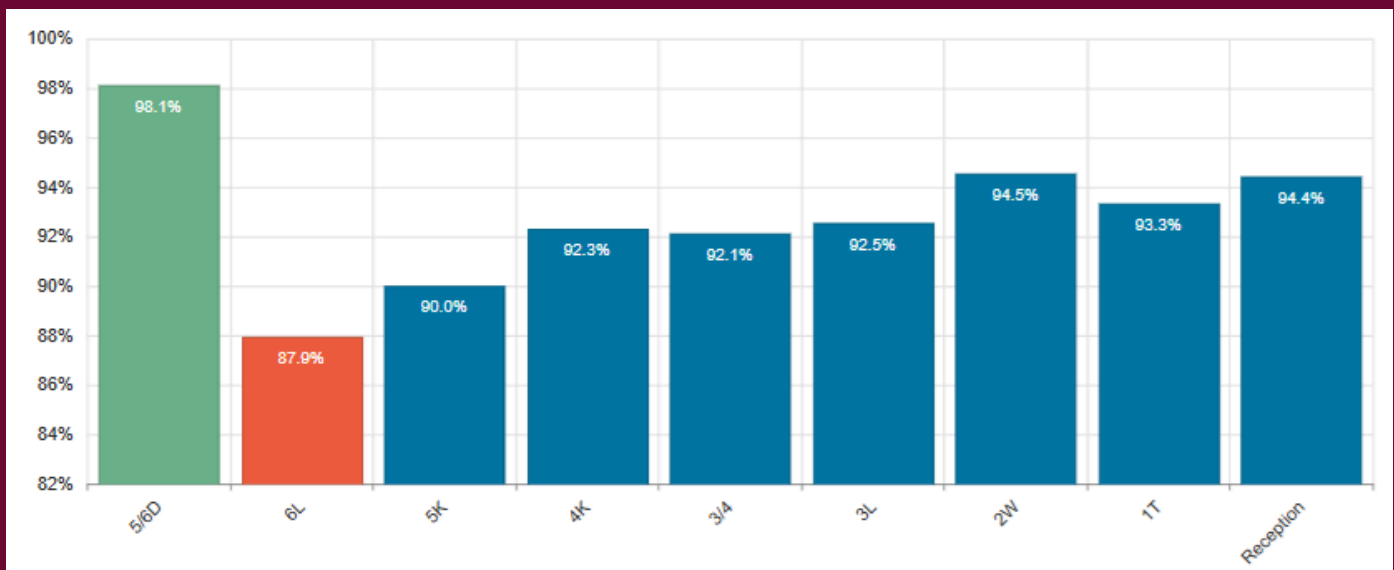
